

MLA Format Checklist

Format

- Typed in 12-point font, Times New Roman
- Double spaced
- Black font color
- No bolding
- One inch margins all four sides
- No extra spaces between paragraphs

Page One

- Last name and page number in top right corner
- Title centered
- Title not in caps, underlined, or quoted
- Double-spaced between Title and first line

Body: Documentation

- Last name and page number in top right corner
- Quotation marks for quotes
- Parentheses for citation
- Period after citation.
- Citation at the end of the sentence.
- All in-text citations match Works Cited list
- Each source listed on Works Cited page is cited at least once in the paper.
- Credit is given each time the information is used, even if it is paraphrased or summarized.
- Omit all but last citation when successive citations are from the same source and page.
- Give the full name of source authors at first mention and only the last name thereafter.

- Block quotes for quotes longer than 3 typed lines or more than 3 lines of poetry/lyrics
 - Extra 1" from left margin
 - No quotation marks
 - No period after citation
 - Still double-spaced

Images

- A caption below each image that gives full reference data.
- Refer to images in the essay as "Fig. 1," "Fig. 2," etc.
- Each image is positioned in a paragraph that analyzes details in the image.
- Image references not included in Works Cited page.

Works Cited Page

- Title: Works Cited
 - 1" from top
 - Correctly capitalized, not underlined or quoted
- Entries are alphabetized according to the author's last name or first entry.
- Entries are not numbered.
- Entries should be double-spaced.
- No extra spaces between entries
- Entries should be formatted with a "hanging indent".
- Entries are correctly formatted
- Everything on the Works Cited List is cited in the paper
- Title of books and periodicals are underlined or italicized consistently
- Titles of short works and articles are in quotes

Polishing & Proofreading

Mechanics:

- Punctuation
- Spelling & Typos
- Pronoun/antecedent agreement
- Verb tense: present for text summary and analysis
- Capitalization
- Consistent pronouns
- Parallel clauses
- Italicize titles of books, films, albums and collections of art.
- Quotation marks for titles of articles, poems, songs, short stories, a painting, or other short work of art.

Style:

- Omit needless words
- Put statements in positive form
- Use definitive, specific language
- Dashes and Colons for clarity and emphasis
- Active voice when doer is of interest

Rubric

PROJECT & ARGUMENT – 5 Points

- ___ An interesting thesis that unifies and drives the essay
- ___ Clear identification and analysis of metaphors in the text
- ___ Thoughtful exploration of the implications of your argument

SOURCES – 5 Points

- ___ Use at least two sources in addition to the main text
- ___ Accurately format citations and Works Cited page
- ___ Integration: clear distinction between source ideas and your own
- ___ Position: thoughtfully agree, disagree or nitpick sources' analysis and interpretation

VOICE – 5 Points

- ___ Clear, effective, logical ideas and language
- ___ Concise phrases that omit needless words
- ___ Metadiscourse that effectively guides reader and structures ideas

EDITING & DESIGN – 5 Points

- ___ Follows all MLA document design conventions
- ___ Careful edited for grammar, typos, and punctuation

ASSIGNMENT REQUIREMENTS – 5 Points

- ___ Includes 3 major assignment sections: metaphor analysis, positioning, & implications
- ___ Length (1500-2000 words)
- ___ Submission by due date (11:50pm Friday, May 15)
